

ORDINANCE NO. 127.

A Bill for an Ordinance to fix water rates and the collection thereof; to regulate the tapping of mains, placing of service pipes and fixtures; providing a penalty for violations of this ordinance; repealing Ordinances No. 92, 109 and 120, and all ordinances and parts of Ordinances in conflict herewith, and declaring an emergency to exist.

THE TOWN OF STAYTON DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That on and after the passage of this Ordinance the following rates shall be charged for the use of water from the Town mains, to-wit:

Section 2. Application for the use of water must be made in writing to the Recorder, and the applicant must state fully the purpose for which the water is to be used, the number of taps or faucets desired, and the number of persons to be supplied.

Section 3. Whenever it is desired to discontinue the use of water for bath tub, water closet, or other fixture, the pipe connecting such faucet must be disconnected, or stopped with metallic plug or cap. All faucets or hose connections must be removed and notice given the recorder before any reduction will be made in amount charged for water.

Section 4. Should the owner or occupant of any premises desire an additional faucet or wish to use the water for a purpose not stated in the original application, a new application must be made and permit obtained from the Recorder.

Section 5. Hereafter all service pipes must be so arranged that the supply to each separate house or premises may be controlled by a separate stopcock within and near the line of the street curb, or at the connection with the street main.

Section 6. Water shall not be furnished for building purposes except upon a satisfactory estimate by the architect or other person having charge of the work, as to the amount required, and must be paid for in advance.

Section 7. The water may at any time be shut off from the mains without notice for repairs or other purposes, and the Town will not be responsible for any consequent damage while the water is temporarily shut off. Hot water faucets should be kept open by the occupant of the premises, to allow the steam to escape from the heaters during the time the water is so shut off.

Section 8. When a permit has been granted for the use of water, a cock will be inserted in the main at the nearest or most convenient place. For an ordinary dwelling the tap will be 3/4 of an inch in diameter, and for other buildings, of such size as may be found necessary. The service pipe shall be attached thereto, and the trench dug and filled to the street curb line nearest the premises by the Town.

Section 9. The charges for the work of inserting the tap will be \$2.00 for a one-inch tap and \$1.00 for a smaller size. Said charges to be paid in all cases by the applicant. The cock and pipe connected thereto from the main to the street curb-line shall remain the property of the Town, and it shall be unlawful for any person other than an employee of the town to interfere therewith.

Section 10. Inside all basements or buildings where the service pipe enters the same, a stop or waste cock, protected from frost, must be placed by which the pipe in the building can be drained during freezing weather; water must not be allowed to run to waste through any faucet or fixture in order to prevent freezing, or kept running at any time longer than is necessary in its proper use. Where waste is found to exist, water will be shut off from the premises; no faucet will be allowed outside of any building except for hose connections, and the latter must have stop and waste cocks

protected from frost. No hose connections will be allowed on sidewalks, except those which require keys for opening them.

Section 11. The service pipes within the premises and through their entire length to the main must be kept in repair and protected from frost at the expense of the occupant. If leaks in the service pipes are found to exist, the occupant of the building must immediately repair the same, and where excavations in the street are made for the purpose of repairing leaks, the excavation must be filled and the pavement repaired.

Section 12. No person shall be allowed to make connections, or alterations in any water main, or other fixture connected therewith, or to connect pipes when they have been disconnected, or to turn water on or off any premises without permission from the recorder or street commissioner.

Section 13. Water rates will be due and payable to the Recorder, in advance, on the first day of each month, and if not paid within the first ten days of the month, the water shall be shut off from the premises by the Marshal or Street Commissioner. Provided, however, that water rates may be paid in advance for any number of months for any calander year.

Section 14. The foregoing rules and regulations contained in this Ordinance must be strictly complied with in every instance, and the water must be paid for in accordance with the schedule of rates in Section 1. of this ordinance.

Section 15. Employees of the Town or any of the officers thereof, are not permitted to make any exceptions whatever, and the right is hereby reserved by the council to amend these rules and regulations or add thereto, as experience may show to be necessary.

Section 16. It shall be unlawful for any person or persons to attach to or detach from any water main or service pipe or other connection through which water is supplied by the Town to water consumers of the Town, or to interfere in any manner with such pipes or connections, without having the written consent of the Recorder or Street Commissioner as the case may be.

Section 17. It shall be the duty of each and every plumber to make a report to the Recorder in writing, of all connections, attachments and extensions made by him, within three days after the work is finished, giving the location of the premises, name of the owner, number of faucets, bath tubs, water closets, fountains, hose and other connections.

Section 18. It shall be unlawful for any person to open a stop or faucet, or leave any stop or faucet open, so as to permit water to waste.

Section 19. Whenever any person within the town of Stayton, shall desire to have his or her water pipes detached from or attached to any ^{main} ₁, he or she shall notify the Recorder or Street Commissioner, as the case may be, and it shall be the duty of such Recorder or Street Commissioner, to give his written consent for such attachment or detachment as required, or shall within twenty-four hours thereafter, upon payment of the reasonable expenses thereof, proceed to make or cause to be made such attachment or detachment as the case may be; provided, always that all water rates and charges against the applicant be fully paid.

Section 20. It shall be unlawful for any house-holder or other consumer of water supplied by the Town of Stayton, to cause or permit water to run or be discharged through the pipes or faucets in any house, building, or lot owned or occupied by such house-holder or any other consumer of water in excess of the quantity actually necessary for domestic irrigation or other lawful purpose for which payment has been made.

Section 21. No sprinkling of lawns or gardens will be allowed or permitted from 9 o'clock in the forenoon until 4 o'clock in the afternoon, nor from 9 o'clock in the evening until 5 o'clock the following morning.

Section 22. All taps, faucets and hose connections shall be immediately closed whenever any fire alarm is given, and shall remain closed until the fire is out and the engine or hose cart returned to the engine room.

Section 23. Any person violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof, in the Recorder's Court shall be punished by a fine not exceeding fifty dollars, or by imprisonment in the Town jail not exceeding thirty days.

Section 24. That all of Ordinance No. 92, passed by the Council February 4th, 1909; Ordinance No. 109, passed by the Council March 5th, 1912; Ordinance No. 120, passed by the Council February 3rd, 1914, and all Ordinances and parts of Ordinances in conflict herewith be and the same are hereby repealed.

Section 25. Whereas, the rates and regulations set forth in this Ordinance will effect the entire water system of the town, it is the judgment of the Council that this ordinance is necessary for the immediate preservation of the peace, health and safety of the town, and an emergency is hereby declared to exist, and that this ordinance shall be in full force and effect immediately upon its passage by the Council and approval by the Mayor.
