

ORDINANCE NO 194.

A BILL for an Ordinance to amend ordinance No 129, Entitled an ordinance to provide for the good conduct, good order, health, and cleanliness, of the town and of persons, and for the protection of persons and property, and to repeal certain ordinances and parts of ordinances relating thereto, and declaring an Emergency to exist.

THE TOWN OF STAYTON DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section, 1, That Section No 28 of ordinance No 129, passed the Council August the 1st 1916, and approved by the Mayor August the 1st 1916, be and the same is hereby amended so as to read as follows, to-wit; It shall be unlawfull to ride any bicycle, Motor cycle, Roller skates, or other vehicle upon any of the sidewalks within the Town of Stayton, for amusement, pleasure or otherwise.

(a) It shall be unlawfull to skate with roller skates or to coast with express wagon by attaching the same to; or by holding onto any Motor vehicle, horse drawn vehicle or horse. upon any of the Streets of the town of stayton; PROVIDED HOWEVER that roller skating may be permitted on portions of certain streets to be designated by the

the Street Commission during certain hours but no roller skating will be allowed after *7.30* P.M. of any day, *any person violating the provisions of this Act shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and on conviction before the Recorder shall be fined in any sum not exceeding \$20.00*

Section 2, Inasmuch as the existing ordinances are insufficient to regulate skating and coasting on the town of Stayton, it is the judgement of this council that an emergency exists, and that for the preservation of the peace, health and safety within the town of Stayton that this ordinance shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its lassage by the council and approval by the Mayor.
