

ORDINANCE NO. 195.

A BILL FOR AN ORDINANCE TO CREATE AND PROVIDE FOR THE APPOINTMENT OF A MUNICIPAL BOXING COMMISSION; TO PRESCRIBE THE DUTIES OF SUCH COMMISSION, TO REGULATE BOXING COMPETITIONS WITHIN THE TOWN LIMITS OF STAYTON; TO PROVIDE PENALTIES FOR VIOLATION HEREOF AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY TO EXIST.

The town of Stayton do ordain as follows:

Section 1. That there is hereby created a municipal boxing commission hereinafter referred to as the "commission", which shall be known as the municipal boxing commission of the town of Stayton, Oregon. Said commission shall be appointed by the mayor, and shall consist of 3 citizens of said town, of Stayton, whose term of office shall be one year from their appointment. At least one member of said commission shall be a reputable licensed practicing physician. Said commission shall serve without salary or compensation, and shall be subject to removal from office at any time during their tenure for such reason as the mayor shall deem good and sufficient. The said commission shall choose one of their number to act as chairman, and another to act as secretary, of said commission, the town attorney shall act as legal advisor to said commission. The said commission shall have power to carry out the provisions of this ordinance, and their duties shall be such as provided for herein.

Section 2. The said commission shall have general supervision and control over all matters pertaining to boxing competitions within the town of Stayton, and shall at all times make rules and regulations not in conflict with the laws of the state of Oregon, or with the ordinances of the town of Stayton, under which all boxing competitions shall be conducted. It shall be unlawful to hold boxing competitions within the town of Stayton, without consent of said commission.

Section 3. Said commission shall have power and authority to make rules to provide for payment of all expenses incident to any boxing competition out of the receipts of such competition. Free admission generally known as passes, issued by such commission shall not exceed two per cent of the seating capacity of the place where such competition is to be held.

Section 4. Every male person desiring to participate in a boxing competition shall register with the secretary of said commission and shall be subject to the rules and regulations of said commission, and shall within six hours before the time of competition be physically examined by a member of said commission who shall be a licensed physician, and if the said commissioner finds from such examination that the applying competitor is physically fit to participate in said boxing competition, he shall certify such fact in writing to the commission. Upon the filing of said physical certificate and the said registration, each applying competitor shall be provided with a written permit to participate in said competition, said permit to be valid for one competition only.

Section 5. It shall be unlawful to hold any boxing exhibition or competition on the first day of the week, commonly called Sunday.

Section 6. Any person violating any of the provisions of this ordinance, or any person or persons conducting, engaging in, or participating in any way in any boxing competition contrary to the provisions of this ordinance or in violation of the laws of Oregon, or the town of Stayton shall upon a plea of guilty or conviction in the recorder's court be punished by a fine of not exceeding \$50.00.

Section 7. Inasmuch as certain persons are desirous of engaging in boxing competition within the next two days, and inasmuch as it is now unlawful to hold boxing competitions in the town of Stayton, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, and this ordinance is hereby declared to be necessary for immediate preservation of the peace and safety of the town of Stayton, and citizens thereof, and this ordinance shall be in full force and effect immediately upon its passage by the common council, and approval by the mayor.

Passed and adopted by the common council this 28th day of February, 1927.
