Swim Lessons Make a Comeback!

Grant funding will cover instructor costs thanks to the dedication of a local citizen and Friends of the Pool

Recently, the Friends of the Pool submitted a grant application to obtain funding for swim lessons at the Stayton Family Memorial Pool. Friends of the Pool member Eric Wiser spearheaded the application process and even offered up a match for the grant, as did the Friends of the Pool. Due to his dedication and efforts, the Doris J. Wipper Fund of the Oregon Community Foundation awarded funding to cover personnel costs for three sessions of swim lessons each year.

Beginning in late 2010, due to budgetary constraints, swim lessons were scaled back to only summer sessions. Prior to the cutbacks, lessons were offered nearly year round with approximately 749 lessons offered a year. In 2012, only 283 lessons were held.

With the award of this grant, additional sessions will be held



in 2013 and 2014. The first two sessions will held this winter, one beginning on February 12th and the second on April 2nd. The third session will be in the spring, beginning on May 7th. There will be scholarships available for those who are unable to afford lessons. These will be available through application to the Friends of the Pool.

Preventing Frozen Pipes

An average of a quarter-million families have their homes ruined and their lives disrupted each winter due to water pipes that freeze and burst. Recovering from frozen pipes is not as simple as calling a plumber. An 1/8" crack in a pipe can spew up to 250 gallons of water a day. Both plastic (PVC) and copper pipes can burst. Here are tips to protect your pipes prior to cold weather hitting.

Before the Cold Hits

Insulate pipes in your home's crawl spaces and attic, these exposed pipes are most susceptible to freezing. **Heat tape** or thermostatically-controlled heat cables can be used to wrap pipes. **Seal leaks** that allow cold air inside near where pipes are located. **Disconnect** garden hoses and, if practical, use an indoor valve to shut-off and drain water from pipes leading to outside faucets.

The City of Stayton Public Works personnel can assist you with shutting off your water if you feel you may have a frozen pipe and/or water meter. If you need assistance Monday through Friday, 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m., contact the Stayton Public Works department at (503) 769-2919 or City Hall at (503) 769-3425.
