Pedestrian Safety Reminder

The Stayton Police Department would like to remind drivers and pedestrians to be vigilant and aware as they go about their daily lives, especially in inclement weather and during the evening hours.

During the month of December, Stayton Police responded to at least three "vehicle vs. pedestrian" crashes. Two of these crashes resulted in very serious injuries sustained by the pedestrian involved.

We urge drivers to take extra care to watch for pedestrians, especially at cross streets and intersections. Be sure to come to a complete stop at stop signs and when required at intersections controlled by traffic signals.

In addition, pedestrians also need to watch for vehicles and ensure it is safe to proceed



across the street before leaving the sidewalk. If you are a pedestrian, it is also important to try to make yourself more visible by wearing light colored clothing and/or reflective clothing.

Pedestrians also need to be mindful of intersections controlled by traffic signals and to obey the crosswalk signal. Pedestrians can be cited for failing to obey a traffic control device if they choose to cross in a crosswalk when the orange hand symbol is activated.

Frozen Pipes — Prepare and Prevent

On average a quarter-million families have their homes ruined and lives disrupted each winter due to water pipes that freeze and burst. Recovering from frozen pipes is not as simple as calling a plumber. An 1/8" crack in a pipe can spew up to 250 gallons of water a day. Both plastic (PVC) and copper pipes can burst. Here are tips to protect your pipes prior to cold weather hitting.



Before the Cold Hits

Insulate pipes in your home's crawl spaces and attic, these exposed pipes are most susceptible to freezing. Heat tape or thermostatically-controlled heat cables can be used to wrap pipes. Seal leaks that allow cold air inside near where pipes are located. Disconnect garden hoses and, if practical, use an indoor valve to shut-off and drain water from pipes leading to outside faucets.

The City of Stayton Public Works can assist you with shutting off your water if you feel you may have a frozen pipe and/or water meter. Do not shut off your own water service. If you need assistance Monday through Friday, 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m., contact the Stayton Public Works department at (503) 769-2919 or City Hall at (503) 769-3425. If you need assistance after normal business hours, please contact the City's afterhours line at (503) 769-3421.
