SUBJECT: Public Works Monthly Operating Report- April 2025

KEY ACTIVITIES STATUS

• WWTP Facility WWTP Facility Effluent flows: 52.51 million gallons were treated during April.

The highest Daily flow was 2.18 million gallons on the 7th and the lowest flow was 1.12 million gallons on the 29^{th} and 30th. The average flow was 1.57 million

gallons. Total rainfall was 2.04 inches. No bio solids were hauled off site.

• WTP Highest production day was 3,423,000 gallons on April 16, 2025.

• Water System Replaced 7 meters. Installed 1 new meter with radio Replaced 1 hydrant.

Replaced 1 radio. Cleaned #3 Filter Bed. Notified 2 users of high usage/possible

leak.

• Streets Swept 120 curb miles with 13 cubic yards of material removed from the streets.

7 yards of gravel applied to gravel roads.

Parks 1 ton of debris collected at parks, 101 hours of park maintenance. Picnic table

refurbishing and securing at Santiam and Pioneer Parks. Established garbage

collection by garbage company for the parks.
