## Community Improvement Grant—Apply Now

Applications are now available for the Stayton Community Improvement Grant program. The goals of the Grant program are to help neighbors work together to accomplish shared goals that support the overall health, vitality, and livability of the place they call "home" and to support non-profit organizations that provide a service to Stayton residents. The City





of Stayton offers these grants to non-profit organizations and to groups of at least three neighbors that are willing to match funding through cash, in-kind donation, and volunteer hours.

Grants are available to support programs and services that directly benefit Stayton residents. Funds may also be spent on public improvements identified by a neighborhood or on private improvements. Examples of public improvements are new or replacement play equipment or landscaping in parks, street tree plantings, or construction or replacement of sidewalks. An example of private improvements would be coordinated improvement to front yard landscaping.

This is a competitive grant program. Applications are reviewed by City staff, and selected grants are awarded by the City Council. For 2020-21, a total of \$30,000 is available to disburse. Individual grant amounts are expected to typically be in the range of \$1,000 to \$5,000 each.

Awardees will be required to complete a brief summary of the project outcomes and submit a minimum of two visual items to illustrate the project (photos, printed materials, etc.). Awardees will be required to account for the allocation of the grant monies at the completion of the project, or at the request of City staff.

## Stayton's Annual Clean-Up Days

The City of Stayton is offering disposal of yard debris, including leaves and brush, on Saturday, November 14th from 9:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. and Saturday, December 5th from 9:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m.



The collection site is at the City of Stayton Shops located at 1820 N. 1<sup>st</sup> Avenue, Stayton. The only cost to Stayton residents is a donation of canned food to be given to the Stayton Food Bank. Those who reside outside city limits, the cost is \$1 per bag.

## **Updates from the Public Works Department**

During 2020, the Public Works Department kept busy even with several projects benefitting the Stayton community. These projects included street improvements and construction projects.

The City partnered with Marion County Public Works on two different street projects. The first was completing slurry seal treatments in the Pioneer Meadows and Jefferson Place subdivisions. The second project was the mill and overlay of Rogue, Deschutes, and Willamette Avenues, completed in August. The partnership with Marion County allowed these projects to cover as much as 40% more area than if the City had obtained contracts on its own.

Additionally, the infrastructure construction for the Lambert Place subdivision is completed and we will see the construction of homes beginning in the near future.
