City Seeking Support of the Library, Pool, and Parks

The City has determined there will continue to be a need for a local option tax levy to maintain service, operations, and to assist with capital improvements for the Stayton Public Library, Stayton Family Memorial Pool, and local parks and trails. Stayton has relied on local option tax levies for this purpose



continuously since 1999 at a rate of \$0.60 per \$1,000 of assessed value. The need



for local option tax levies results from the statewide tax limitation measures, Measures 47 and 50, passed in 1996 and 1997 respectively. The current levy expires June 30, 2021.

Lack of funding from a local option levy for the Library, Pool, and Parks, will have a devastating impact on the City's quality of life amenities. The Stayton Family Memorial Pool

will remain closed indefinitely. The operations, services, and programs of the Stayton Public Library will remain significantly reduced and with no further

funding, additional library services will be eliminated. The ongoing care and upkeep in the parks will be limited and there will be no funding for park amenities or upgrades.

It is expected the Council will move forward with placing a levy for support of the Library, Pool, and Parks on the May 18, 2021 Special District Election.







City Seeks Members for Public Arts Commission

The Public Arts Commission was recently established by the Stayton City Council and is tasked with promoting educational, cultural, economic, and general welfare of Stayton by actively pursuing the placement of public art in public spaces within Stayton city limits. There are currently five vacant positions on the Arts Commission.

Proposed Residential Zoning Amendments

Over the past 18 months, the Planning Commission has been discussing a set of amendments to the City's Land Use and Development Code that would substantially alter the way new residential development is regulated by the City. The framework of Stayton's residential zoning is essentially the same as it was originally when adopted in the mid-1970s, when the community was half the size it is today.

The proposed amendments would transform the City's residential zoning from minimum lot size-based regulations to density-based regulations, providing greater flexibility in the design of residential zones and continue to regulate the types of housing units permitted in each zone.

Police Department Receives Grant for AED's

During the summer of 2020, the Stayton Police Department received a generous grant from the Doris J. Wipper Fund, which is part of the Oregon Community Foundation. The award funded the purchase of 10 Automatic External Defibrillators (AED) and associated equipment. The department had several AEDs donated by the Stayton Fire



Department, but there were not enough for each patrol car. This award allowed the department to deploy AEDs along with Naloxone in every patrol vehicle. To enhance the safety of Stayton residents, the donated AED's were also deployed to various City buildings for use by residents and City employees if a cardiac event occurs.

Stayton Police Officers respond to many calls, including specific medical calls to assist Stayton Fire Department and Santiam Ambulance. Officers are often first on-scene and can begin necessary lifesaving measures. The fast response gives us the potential to make a significant difference in the survivability of someone having a cardiac emergency.
