
Meet Comfort K9 Atlas

In 2020, the Stayton Police Department welcomed Comfort K9, Atlas, to the community.

A Comfort K9 is a facility dog that works at the station with First Responders. As you know, First Responders are exposed to stress and trauma in their jobs. Comfort K9s in the facility help First Responders decompress during their workday and enhance their work life and personal life. Job-related trauma had been



proven to increase poor job performance, staff burnout, turnover, depression,

Stayton's Exceptional Quality (EQ) Class-A Biosolids are available for pick-up (by appointment only) weekdays year round from 8:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. at 957 Jetters Way in Stayton.

EQ Class-A Biosolids are excellent to use as a fertilizer, solid amendment (builder or conditioner), mulch, or as a potting medium. They are not made from livestock manure or yard debris; free of pathogens; heat cured in a temperature controlled dryer; digitally monitored and laboratory



tested; and designated EPA EQ Class-A status "for use without restriction" (CRF40-503).


May 18, 2021 Election—Vote!
