Looking to Volunteer in your Community?

Have you ever considered volunteering time in your community? In order to operate a City and represent the citizens of the entire community, the City Council relies on a number of boards, committees, and commissions to help them understand the needs and desires of the community. These groups provide valuable insight to the City Council and City staff.

Currently, there are vacancies on the following City boards and committees:

- Parks and Recreation Board (two vacant positions)
- Public Arts Commission (four vacant positions)
- Budget Committee (two vacant positions)

The **Parks and Recreation Board** is responsible for developing and maintaining parks and recreation programs, and serves as an advisory board to the City Council. The Board meets on the first Tuesday of each month at 6:00 p.m.

The **Public Arts Commission** is a newly established board. The purpose of the Commission is to promote educational, cultural, economic, and general welfare of Stayton by actively pursuing the placement of public art in public spaces within the Stayton city limits while also serving to preserve and develop public access to the arts. The Commission is responsible for assisting the Council and other City boards and commissions in using public art to enhance existing development in public parks, other public lands, and in public structures.

The **Budget Committee** meets annually to review the proposed fiscal year budget. Typically meetings occur in May, with a total of three to four meetings. The Committee is comprised of the Mayor and City Council plus six community members.
