Low Interest Loans for Residential Home Improvements

Is your home in need of repair? New furnace, insulation, or safety improvements?

The City of Stayton Housing Rehabilitation Program has renewed funding available for home improvements for income-qualified homeowners. Properties must be owner-occupied. The owners must meet the current guidelines as low or moderate income households and have enough equity in their homes to meet

the loan guidelines. The income eligibility depends on household size. One example, for a household of 4, the total household income must be \$56,550 or less.

The loans may be used to repair or replace roofing, plumbing and electrical problems, carpet or linoleum, painting, dry-rot, foundation repairs. The



maximum loan amount is \$25,000. No monthly payments required—the loan is repaid from the proceeds when you sell your home. An interest rate of 4% is charged for the first five years and following that, no additional interest accrues.

Funds for the program come from a Community Development Block Grant from the Federal Department of Housing and Urban Development. Tips to Avoid Automobile Thefts

Over the past year, Stayton has seen an increase in thefts from automobiles. This is a reminder to not leave valuables in view in your vehicle, and remove your spare key and garage door opener from your car. Keep your vehicle in "showroom condition," free of any items. The less attractive your vehicle's interior is, the greater chance a thief will move along. Often



thieves are simply checking doors to see if they are unlocked, so make sure you lock your doors.

If you are a victim of a theft from your motor vehicle, please contact us to file a report. You may think it doesn't matter, but by reporting activity, it helps the Police Department know where illegal activity is happening, and we can take steps to combat the issue. With your help, we can make our community safer.

Volunteering Time in Your Community

Have you ever considered volunteering time in your community? We are looking for civic-minded volunteers to fill vacancies on three of our boards:

- <u>Budget Committee (two vacancies)</u>: Meets annually to review the proposed City
 of Stayton fiscal year budget. Meetings typically occur the first two weeks of May,
 but on occasion, additional meetings may be held at other times during the year.
- Parks and Recreation Board (one vacancy): Meets on the first Tuesday of each
 month at 6:00pm. The Board is responsible for developing and maintaining parks
 and recreation programs, and serves as an advisory board to the City Council.
- <u>Public Arts Commission (two vacancies)</u>: The purpose of the Commission is to
 pursue placement of public art in public spaces within Stayton city limits while
 also serving to reserve and develop public access to the arts.

Enhanced Traffic Patrols Result in DUII Arrests



The Stayton Police Department has been participating in enhanced traffic patrols. Some of the enforcement has been specifically focused on driving under the influence of intoxicants. The effort resulted in eleven arrests for DUII in the month of January 2022, which is nearly 4 times that of January 2021. Funding for these extra patrols is made possible through grants and in partnership with the Oregon Department of Transportation.
