

ORDINANCE NO 200.

A BILL FOR AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND SECTION 15 OF ORDINANCE NO 129. OF THE TOWN OF STAYTON, OREGON, PROVIDING FOR THE GOOD CONDUCT, ORDER, PEACE AND SAFETY OF SAID TOWN, AND PROVIDING PUNISHMENT FOR VIOLATION OF SUCH ORDINANCE, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

THE TOWN OF STAYTON DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1, That Section 15 of ordinance Number 129, which ordinance was passed the Council and approved by the Mayor on the 1st day of August, 1916. be and the same is hereby amended to read as follows:

Section 15, That any person who shall be guilty of any violent, riotous, and/or disorderly conduct, or shall be guilty of any assault and/or assault and battery against or upon the person of another, or shall be guilty of fighting, or shall be guilty of using any profane, abusive indecent, obscene, improper and/or immoral conduct, or shall be guilty of any act, conduct, or other thing whereby the dignity, peace, quiet health and/or safety of the Town of Stayton or of any person or persons shall be disturbed or endangered, within or upon any street, house, building and/or other place within the Town of Stayton, shall upon conviction thereof before the Recorder of said Town or before the Mayor of said Town when the Recorder is absent, indisposed or otherwise prevented from acting, be fined not less than \$5.00 nor more than \$50.00, or shall be imprisoned not less than 5 days nor more than 30 days.

Section 2, Said Section 15 of Ordinance No. 129, in its form prior to the adoption of the foregoing amendment, shall remain in full force and effect for the punishment of all violations thereof committed prior to the time of adoption of said amendment.

Section 3. Whereas there is no adequate Ordinance now in force to preserve the good order, peace and safety of the Town of Stayton, it is the judgement of this Council that an emergency exists, and that for the immediate preservation of the peace, health and safety of the Town of Stayton it is necessary that this Ordinance take effect and be in force upon its passage by the Council and approval by the Mayor.
