ordinance no. 211

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE VACATION OF DULY DEDICATED STREETS AND ALLEYS DESCRIBED HEREIN IN THE TOWN OF STAYTON, MARION COUNTY, OREGON.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF STAYTON:

Section 1. That whereas the Common Council of the Town of Stayton did on the 2nd day of February, by resolution, propose the vacation of streets and alleys as hereinafter described and that whereas said resolution did specify and call for a hearing to be held in the City Hall of the Town of Stayton, Marion County, Oregon on the 11th day of March, 1953 at 8 o'clock P. M. Pursuant to said resolution notices were posted at both ends of the proposed vacation and said notices were published four consecutive times in the Stayton Mail, a newspaper of general circulation, published in Stayton, Marion County, Oregon, stating the time, place and date of said hearing.

Whereas said hearing was held on March 11, 1953 and there were no objections or remonstrances and whereas the Common Council of the Town of Stayton, Marion County, Oregon, directed the City Recorder to prepare and draft an ordinance vacating the hereinafter described real property.

Section 2. It is hereby declared that the following described real property, streets and alleys are hereby vacated, to-wit:

Western Street from the South line of Darby Street to the North line of Spaniol Street and all of Spaniol Street as the same are shown and exist by virtue of Forrette's Addition to the Town of Stayton, Marion County, Oregon as recorded in Volume 16, Page 35, Record of Plats, Marion County Recorders Office, Marion County, Oregon.

ALSO

A 16 foot alley running north and south and borders with the south line of Marion Street on the North and the Salem Water Ditch on the South and being a 16 foot alley located in Block 8 U. Whitney's Addition to the Town of Stayton, Marion County, Oregon.

ALSO

That portion of Santiam Street which is bordered by the west

line of Third Street and the east line of Highway #222 Santiam Street as the same exists between Third Street and Highway #222 (which is also known as First Street) Town of Stayton, Marion County, Oregon.
