## ORDINANCE NO. 292

AN ORDENANCE REGULATING CONDITIONS OF ACCEPTANCE OF STREETS IN A NEW SUBDIVISION: AND SIDEWALKS AND CURBING WITHIN THE TOWN OF STAYTON: AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

Be it ordained by the Common Council of the Town of Stayton; and

Section 1. That all new streets shall be a minimum of sixty feet in width, save and except that the Town Council shall have authority to waive said sixty feet to fifty feet in case of unusual circumstances.

Section 2. That all new streets shall be laid out to grade and in a condition acceptable to the regulations of the Town Council and shall have all curbing built to specifications as set forth by the Town Council or its street superintendent.

Section 3. No person shall receive a building permit within the limits of the Town of Stayton, nor shall any street be accepted by the Town Council unless a plan for curbs and sidewalks shall be submitted to be built to a grade and under specifications as set forth by the Town Council or its street Superintendent.

Section 4. Inasmuch as this ordinance is necessary immediately for the public, health, peace and safety of the Town of Stayton, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this ordinance shall be in full force and effect immediately from and after its passage by the council and approval by the mayor.
