

ORDINANCE NO. 365

An Ordinance levying a special property tax of \$750.00 per year outside the constitutional six percent limitation, for a period of five years beginning with the fiscal year 1967-68, to provide funds for enforcement of ordinances to regulate keeping, running at large, impounding, and disposing of dogs; submitting this ordinance to the legal voters of the City of Stayton for their approval or rejection at a special city election to be held April 18, 1967; and declaring an emergency.

THE CITY OF STAYTON DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. To provide funds to enforce its ordinances regulating the keeping, running at large, impounding, and disposing of dogs, within the City of Stayton, and for no other purpose, the Council each year for a period of five consecutive years, beginning with the fiscal year 1967-68, shall levy a special property tax of \$750.00 per year outside the limitation imposed by Article XI, Section 11, of the Constitution of the State of Oregon. The proceeds of such tax levies, with such interest as may accrue thereon, shall be set aside by the City Recorder in a "Dog Ordinance Enforcement Fund", separate and distinct from other funds of the city.

Section 2. As provided in ORS 280.080 the Council estimates that the total outlay for the purposes of this ordinance, including clerical and administrative costs for the five years indicated in Section 1 hereof, will be \$3,750.00.

Section 3. This ordinance is submitted to the legal voters of the City of Stayton for their approval or rejection at a special city election hereby called to be held between the hours of 8:00 o'clock a.m. and 8:00 o'clock p.m. on April 18, 1967.

Section 4. The following ballot title prepared by the City Attorney under which this ordinance shall be submitted to the legal voters of the city, is hereby approved and adopted:

ORDINANCE REFERRED TO THE VOTERS BY THE CITY COUNCIL

Shall Ordinance No. **365** of the City of Stayton, Oregon, be adopted to authorize a property tax levy by the City Council of \$750.00 per year outside the limitation imposed by Article XI, Section 11, of the Constitution of the State of Oregon, for five consecutive years beginning with the fiscal year 1967-68, to provide funds for the enforcement of its ordinances regulating the keeping, running at large, impounding, and disposing of dogs within such city, at an aggregate cost from such levies for the said five years, of \$3,750.00?

Section 5. The polling place and the judges and clerks for such election shall be as follows:

Polling Place: Fire Hall, 511 N. First Ave., Stayton, Oregon.

The Recorder is hereby instructed and directed to post and publish notices of such election in the manner provided by Ordinance No. 242 of such city and to furnish to the election board for such election the necessary records, ballot boxes, tally sheets, and supplies for such election.

Section 6. Such election shall be conducted in accordance with the election laws of the State of Oregon and with the Charter

and pertinent ordinances of such city. Upon approval by the voters of such ordinance the Mayor, in conformity with said Ordinance No. 242, shall issue his proclamation declaring the result of such election.

Section 7. It is hereby adjudged and declared that since existing conditions in the City of Stayton with respect to regulation of dogs are such that funds are necessary for such purpose and this ordinance therefore is necessary for the peace, health, safety, and general welfare of such city and its inhabitants, an emergency is declared to exist, and this Ordinance shall be in full force and effect, subject to adoption thereof by the voters at the election hereby called, from and after its passage and approval by the Mayor.
