

ORDINANCE NO. 106 A.

A Bill for an Ordinance providing for the manner of submitting an amendment to Section 15 of Chapter IX, of the Town Charter, of the Town of Stayton, Oregon, to the legal voters of said town, as proposed by initiative petition; and providing for the holding of a special election for that purpose, and matters kindred thereto.

THE TOWN OF STAYTON DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That, Whereas, an initiative petition has been filed with the Town Recorder, providing for the submission of an amendment to Section 15 of Chapter IX. of the Town Charter, to the legal voters of the Town of Stayton, Oregon, for their approval or rejection; and whereas the General Laws providing for such elections are cumbersome, and elections held thereunder expensive; and whereas, said amendment is necessary to enable the people of Stayton to improve their water system; and Whereas said town needs more adequate fire protection:

THEREFORE, THE TOWN OF STAYTON DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS: That a special election shall be held, and is hereby called to be held on the 29th of May, 1911, which election shall be held in all respects and in the manner in which general elections are held in the Town of Stayton, at which time said proposed amendment to Section 15 of Chapter IX. of the Town Charter shall be submitted to the legal voters of said Town, for their approval or rejection. Which proposed amendment reads as follows:

"The Council of said Town shall never create any indebtedness in excess of \$9,000.00"

Section 2. The title and text of said proposed amendment shall be printed in full, on the official ballot and each voter shall designate his intention by voting "Yes" or "No"

Section 3. The Recorder shall, not later than ten days before said proposed election, cause notices of said election, together with the ballot title and full text of said proposed amendment to be posted in three public places, and also to cause said notice of election and the full text of said proposed amendment to be published in the "Stayton Mail" at least five days before said election.

Section 4. Whereas, the present water system is inadequate for fire protection, and whereas, the "dry season" will soon be here, it is the judgment of this Council that an emergency exists, and that it is necessary for the public safety that this Ordinance shall become operative upon its approval by the Mayor.

Passed by the Council of the Town of Stayton, Oregon, this 17th day of May, 1911.
