## ORDINANCE NO. 137.

A Bill for an Ordinance to regulate the placing and hanging of signs and awnings over, across or on any sidewalk, street or alley within the Town of Stayton, Oregon; to provide a penalty for the violations of this ordinance; and declaring an emergency to exist.

## THE TOWN OF STAYTON DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. It shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation to hang up, nail up, or in any way place any sign, display card, display board or other advertising matter over, across or on any sidewalk, street or alley, or to nail or hang any sign, display cord, display board or any other advertising matter on or to any post, electric pole or awning, or over any sidewalk, street or alley within the corporate limits of the Town of Stayton, Oregon, Provided, however that the Council may on application by any person, permit the erection of electric signs, or the lettering of awnings.

All awnings in front of any building or structure, or over or across any sidewalk, street or alley, constructed of any material whatever, for the protection from sun or rain shall be placed so that the lowest part thereof shall be not less than 78 inches above such sidewalk or street.

Section 3. It shall be the duty of the marshal or any police officer of said Town to remove any sign, display card, display board, or other advertisement, or awning over any sidewalk, street or alley erected in violation of this ordinance upon the written order of the Recorder. It shall be the duty of the Marshal and Recorder to see that this Ordinance is strictly enforced.

Section 4. Any person, firm or corporation violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall on conviction before the Recorder be fined in any sum not exceeding \$25.00.

Section 5. Whereas the provisions of this ordinance are designed to protect the traveling public upon and over the sidewalks, streets and alleys of the Towh, it is the judgment of the Council that an emergency exists, and that this ordinance is necessary for the immediate preservation of the peace, health and safety of the Town, and that it shall become immediately operative upon its passage by the Council and approval by the Mayor.
