A Bill for an Ordinance to change the time for holding the general annual elections in the Town of Stayton, in Marion County, Oregon.

THE COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF STAYTON DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That the time for holding the general election in the Town of Stayton, shall be changed from the time now fixed by law, and that hereafter there shall be a general election held in the Town of Stayton on the first Monday of December, annually.

Section 2. At the next general election held in the Town of Stayton, on the first Monday in December, 1901, as provided in this Ordinance, two of the Councilmen shall be elected for the term of one year and two of the Councilmen shall be elected for the term of two years, and who shall at the first meeting of said Council, after such election decide by lot who shall serve for the term of one year and who shall serve for the term of two years.
