ORDINANCE NO. 508

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CODE SECTION NUMBERED 6.652, 6.560, 7.185, 7.190 and 7.205; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

THE CITY OF STAYTON ORDAINS AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Section VI of the Stayton Code is amended as follows:

6.652. Public Peace - Discarded Vehicles

<u>Subsection 2</u>. For the purpose of this section, "discarded" means any vehicle which is in one or more of the following conditions:

- a. inoperative
- b. wrecked
- c. dismantled
- d. partially dismantled
- e. abandoned
- f. junked
- q. unlicensed

Discarded vehicles may be deemed to include major parts of vehicles, including but not limited to, bodies, engines, body parts, transmissions and rear ends.

6.560. Impoundment - Redemption by Owner

- 1. Owners of keepers of impounded animals shall have five days from the date of notice of impoundment, whether mailed, posted or delivered orally, to claim the animal. If the owner or keeper fails to claim the animal within said five days time, the animal shall be disposed of as provided in Sections 6.563 and 6.570. (368)
- 2. The owner or keeper of an impounded animal may redeem the animal upon payment to the City Administrator the actual cost of boarding such animal, together with all applicable license fees required if the animal is not licensed upon impoundment.
- 3. The impoundment fee as provided in Subsection (2) above shall be the actual cost of boarding per animal, for the first impoundment and \$35 per animal for each subsequent impoundment.

Section 2. Section VII of the Stayton Code is amended as follows:

- 7.185. Offenses on other property open to public travel Applicability of Oregon Vehicle Code
 - 1. The provisions of the Oregon Vehicle Code shall apply upon any other property open to public travel. Any conduct or status that would constitute a traffic offense, infraction, or crime under the Oregon Traffic Code, if it occurred on a public street will, if it occurs on other property open to public travel, constitute a municipal traffic infraction under the provisions of this section.

Subsection 2. Repeal subsection.

7.190. Offenses on other property open to public travel - Specific Offenses

Repeal entire section.

7.205. Parking Regulations - Prohibited Parking or Standing

Subsection 3. Repeal subsection.

Section 3. It is hereby adjudged and declared that existing conditions are such that this Ordinance is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, and safety; and, owing to the urgent necessity of maintaining the public peace, an emergency is declared to exist and this ordinance shall take effect and be in full force and effect from and after the 7th day of December, 1978.
