## RESOLUTION NO. 378

A RESOLUTION CONSENTING TO THE IMPLEMENTATION OF THE MARION COUNTY CIVIL FORFEITURE ORDINANCE NO. 770 WITHIN THE CORPORATE LIMITS OF THE CITY OF STAYTON.

WHEREAS, the Oregon Revised Statutes, under ORS 203.040, as amended in 1977, allow a City to consent by resolution to the implementation of County ordinances with the City's jurisdiction; and

WHEREAS, the Common Council of the City of Stayton has enacted a Civil Forfeiture Ordinance No. 621; and

WHEREAS, the Marion County Sheriff's office has occasion to make arrests within the City Limits of Stayton, but without a consent resolution pursuant to ORS 203.040, as amended in 1977, may not seize proceeds of the criminal activity; and

WHEREAS, Marion County has requested that the Common Council of the City of Stayton consent to the application of the Marion County Civil Forfeiture Ordinance No. 770 within the City of Stayton; and

WHEREAS, The Common Council of the City of Stayton finds that the implementation of both the City Civil Forfeiture Ordinance No. 621 and the Marion County Civil Forfeiture Ordinance No. 770 within the City Limits of Stayton by the respective police agencies will enhance the enforcement of criminal law within the City of Stayton;

NOW THEREFORE, THE CITY OF STAYTON DOES HEREBY RESOLVE:

To consent to the implementation of the Marion County Civil Forfeiture Ordinance No. 770 within the corporate limits of the City of Stayton;
