# \$4.8 million received for Infrastructure Improvements



The City of Stayton has several infrastructure projects that are aimed at addressing critical issues and concerns of residents. The City has been identifying and pursuing opportunities for funding for a wide variety of our infrastructure needs.

We are pleased to share that, thanks to the efforts of City staff and the support of our Representative, Stayton will receive \$3 million from the State of Oregon for wastewater infrastructure improvements. This amount will be used to

address the existing sanitary sewer capacity issue and allow for new economic development within the community, including future residential development. The funds are to be allocated to Stayton's sewer infrastructure improvement along Ida Street and Marion Street from Evergreen Avenue to 4th Avenue.

In addition, the City of Stayton will be receiving \$1.8 million in congressionally appointed funds from the Federal Government. The funds will go towards regional stormwater improvements to bolster existing and future economic development. This is a major step towards removing barriers that prevent development of industrial land in the area, which could create opportunities for manufacturing, agriculture, and food processing, as well as other industries and businesses. We at the City are thankful for our Representatives in Congress for selecting and supporting the project.

When asked what are the next steps, City Manager Julia Hajduk said, "We know that there are many more needs within the community, including streets, and we will continue to work hard to identify funding to help address the infrastructure needs in the community."

# Open Burning Season in Oregon - Guidelines

It is open burning season in Oregon, that means residents will be able to burn yard debris and vegetation. This spring, the burn season will be from **March 1st - June 15th**. Before burning anything, call the **Daily Burn line at 1-887-982-0011** for burn hours and safety reminders, it is updated daily. Any burning should follow the guidelines provided by the Oregon Department of Environmental Quality (DEQ) which can found on their site, here: https://www.oregon.gov/deq/aq/Pages/Burning.aspx.

Allowed Materials: yard debris, wood, needles, leaves, and plants from the burner's property.

**Prohibited Materials**: asbestos, asphalt, industrial waste, automotive parts, material soaked in chemicals, plastic, rubber, and any other material that may cause hazardous smoke or noxious odors.
