Community Improvement Grant Projects - August Updates



It has been several months since the 'Community Improvement' grants were awarded. Since then, Stayton has had the Father-Daughter Dance with a western theme of "Boots & Beauties". The event received over 200 attendees. The event organizers plan for this to return as an annual event.

The downtown has seen several improvements funded with the grants. Marketplace at the Grove's renovated their sidewalk. Further down,

the Florence parking lot received new pavement and the small lot next to it was paved with a splash of color added for a new event space, debuting with the Stayton Farmer's Market. Recently, Revitalize Downtown Stayton installed eight (8) new pet waste pick-up stations to keep downtown Stayton clean and pet-

friendly. Bike racks are soon to follow.

As for neighborhood improvements, a newly constructed 'free little library' has been installed near Kathy St. and a neighborhood was finally able to clean-up an alleyway, improving the quality of life for the residents and improving the aesthetic of the area.

It has been amazing to see the community projects become a reality. We look forward to see what the community has planned for the next 'Community Improvement' grants.
