"If I Were Mayor" Collaborative Student Contest

All across Oregon, Mayors are reaching out to their local schools and asking students the question, "What would you do if *you* were Mayor?" It is a question that invokes new ideas, an opportunity for students to learn more about their city and envision the possibilities of their future.

The "If I Were Mayor..." contest will be in two parts, a local contest and a state contest. However, this year is special for the cities of Aumsville, Stayton, Sublimity and Turner, as it will be a collaboration of local mayors. This collaboration includes Mayor Ceja (Aumsville), Mayor Quigley (Stayton), Mayor Kingsbury (Sublimity), and Mayor Horning (Turner). Students from each city will submit their projects, then the projects will be reviewed by the mayors, and together they will select a project winner for each category. Submissions will be accepted until March 1, 2024.

Every student in these communities is eligible to submit a project, including those who are enrolled in home-school and in alternative academic programs. The categories and prizes include:

- \$50 Elementary School (Grades 4 5) Poster Contest (Photo of poster can be PNG, JPEG, BMP or PDF files)
- \$100 Middle School (Grades 6 8) Essay Contest (500 1000 words, Word, PDF, PowerPoint, or online essay format)
- \$150 High School (Grade 9 12) Digital Media Presentations (1 3 minutes, Videos only, MP4, or online video format)

After the local contest has concluded, each city's Mayor will submit selected students' projects to the Oregon Mayor's Association (OMA) for the statewide contest. The OMA will select the winning students at the OMA Summer Conference in Klamath Falls at the Running Y Ranch on **July 18 - 20, 2024**.
