Letter to the City - Street Improvements

Summer has started off strong, the City budget is now fully adopted, and we have begun a new fiscal year. In prior letters, I discussed budget "buckets" and how the budget is determined in a yearlong cycle. Now let's move to the next step of how the budget will fund, maintain and improve the City of Stayton, specifically the streets.

Stayton's streets have been on a slow decline over the last few years, with the rising cost and City's street fees remain-



ing the same for decades, many necessary maintenance projects for streets were postponed to a future date. Fast forward to now and nearly half of streets are in need of major rehabilitation or reconstruction.

Our current funding is insufficient to allow for significant improvement throughout the City. We have identified several strategies to help increase funding and enable more improvements to be done within the next 5-years including: Adjustments to street fees and local gas tax, a bond/loan, state and federal grants, general fund supplement, and urban renewal. We are dedicated to finding the best strategies to provide the community with the streets they deserve and provide as many opportunities as possible for improvement. However, we need your input to help guide our next steps to improving the streets.

Stayton Utility Rates Changes

The Stayton City Council approved utility rate changes at their April 1, 2024 meeting that go into effect **July 1, 2024** and will be reflected in August bills. The increases for water, wastewater, and stormwater are in accordance with a utility rate study conducted by an outside consultant. The increases are necessary to ensure that the revenues are sufficient to operate and maintain the infrastructure both now and into the future. Most of the utility rates are fixed monthly rates but bills may vary month to month depending on the amount of water usage. The transportation fees were not changed.
