Community Improvement Grant 2025



As winter draws to a close, it's time to start planning for springtime. This season often brings a sense of renewal, igniting people's desire to mix thing up and start new projects after being couped up during the colder months.

Let that inspiration fuel your imagination to improve the community, the Stayton City Council has launched the Community Improvement Grant 2025. The Community Improvement grant is a chance to kick-start a project for your neighborhood or for your business. This a com-

petitive grant program, application will be reviewed by the City staff and selected grants will be awarded by the City Council at a later date. Grant amounts should **not** exceed \$5,000.

Many readers may recall that last year's Community Improvement Grant made several projects possible, including the paving of the space near the Florence Street parking lot, a Father-Daughter cowboy dance for all ages, installing public bike racks in Downtown Stayton, and many more. Each project helped rejuvenate familiar places, brought people together, and opened up new opportunities for the community.

The Community Improvement Grant will be accepting submissions starting February 1st until March 28th.

'If I Were Mayor' Student Contest 2025

The 'If I Were Mayor' student contest is here! Students will use their imagination and skills to envision a city where they are mayor and share what changes they would make to help their community and improve the city.

There are three categories for each age group each with their own type of project.



- Grade 4-5 will submit a poster using any art medium.
- Grade 6-8 a 500-1,000 word essay.
- Grade 9-12 a 1-3 minute digital presentation.

The mayors of Aumsville, Sublimity and Stayton will select a winner from each category for each city, the students of those projects will receive a gift card as well as a gift card for their classroom. (Prizes vary for each category).

All projects must be submitted by March 21, 2025 with a completed OMA entry form.

Stayton Police Department Receives NWAA Accreditation



In March of 2024, Stayton PD began the accreditation process by matching their policies with the NWAA standards and providing "proofs" of compliance. This was followed by an initial inspection of our proofs and documentation by the NWAA assessor and then an on-site inspection on December 16. The assessors submitted a nomination to the board, and it was reviewed during the January 8th Northwest Accreditation Alliance Board meeting. Per NWAA President Scott Hayes, "the Board unani-

mously recommended that your agency be granted its accredited status, a significant achievement that reflects the high standards and dedication of your team."

The recent accreditation of Stayton Police through the Northwest Accreditation Alliance (NWAA) brings several benefits to the department and the community it serves. Some key advantages include:

- Enhanced Professional Standards: Accreditation ensures that Stayton Police meet established
 regional standards for law enforcement operations. This improves the overall professionalism,
 effectiveness, and efficiency of the department. Accreditation provides independent confirmation
 that policies comply with professional standards.
- Improved Community Trust: Accreditation demonstrates the department's commitment to accountability, transparency, and high-quality service, which can help build and maintain trust between the police force and the community.
- Increased Officer Safety and Accountability: By following best practices and policies, the department improves officer training, safety procedures, and performance evaluation. This helps ensure officers are equipped to handle a wide range of situations safely and professionally.
- Access to Resources: Accredited departments often gain access to additional resources, such as
 grants, training programs, and support from other law enforcement agencies, which can further
 improve the department's capabilities.
- Enhanced Organizational Effectiveness: Accreditation requires the department to conduct regular self-assessments, ensuring continuous improvement and long-term sustainability. It helps in identifying areas for improvement and refining policies and procedures.
- Public Assurance: Accreditation signals to the public that the police department is committed to
 upholding high standards, which can enhance the perception of the police as being competent,
 reliable, and responsible. This works to enhance public confidence in law enforcement.

Accreditation is currently not a mandate for all law enforcement agencies in Oregon. Of the 174 police agencies in Oregon, there are currently 61 accredited with NWAA and 4 with CALEA. Accreditation is a voluntary process for law enforcement agencies in the state. Stayton chose to pursue accreditation as it strengthens the Stayton Police Department's ability to serve its community while adhering to recognized best practices in law enforcement.
