


Smoke Testing Throughout July/August

The City will be conducting smoke testing throughout Stayton in July and August to identify issues within the sewer line.

The City will be conducting smoke testing throughout the community during the months of July and August as part of an ongoing effort to identify and address issues within the sewer system.

Smoke testing is a common and effective method used to detect sewer lines. By introducing non-toxic smoke into the sewer system, crews can identify defects such as broken or cracked sewer laterals — the pipes that connect individual properties to the main sewer line.





Smoke testing can also identify cross connections, where storm drains are tied into the city sewer main. By identifying and fixing cross connections, we can prevent storm water from entering the sewer system, which can overload pipes and treatment facilities. Excess storm water in the sewer system can also cause backups, overflows, and added strain on the wastewater treatment plant.

Throughout July and August, residents may notice smoke coming from holes in the ground during testing. This is normal and not harmful.

Utility Rate Increases and Ways to Save!

New Utility Rates Begin July 1, 2025. Modest Increases Support Essential Services, with Savings Options Available for Residents

On April 7, 2025, Stayton City Council approved utility rate changes that go into effect on July 1, 2025. The increases for water, wastewater, and stormwater are necessary to ensure that revenues are sufficient to operate and maintain the infrastructure both now and into the future. There is no increase to street maintenance.

The City of Stayton will be implementing increases to utility rates as follows:

- Water: base fees 3% (no change for water usage)
- Wastewater: residential 3% / non-residential 6.75%
- Stormwater: 3%
- Street maintenance: no change
