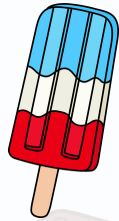

November 3, 2026 General Election

Candidate Filing Now Open for General Election

The City of Stayton is governed by a council consisting of a Mayor plus five Councilors nominated and elected from the city at large.

At the 2026 General Election, the positions of the Mayor and three Councilors will appear on the ballot.

Key filing dates:

- Last day for elected incumbent candidates to file: August 18, 2026
- Last day for appointed incumbent and new candidates to file: August 25, 2026
- Last day for candidate to withdraw: August 28, 2026
- Election Day: November 3, 2026

Your Home's Water Shut Off Valve

Know Which Valve is Yours

It is important to know the location of your home's main water shut-off valve in the meter box.



Please do not tamper with the water meter or the shut-off valve closest to the street, as they are City property.

Under Stayton Municipal Code 13.16.580(3), the property owner is responsible for any damage to the water meter.

The meter may have a second (owner's) shut-off valve located on the house side of the water meter. This valve is your property and responsibility.

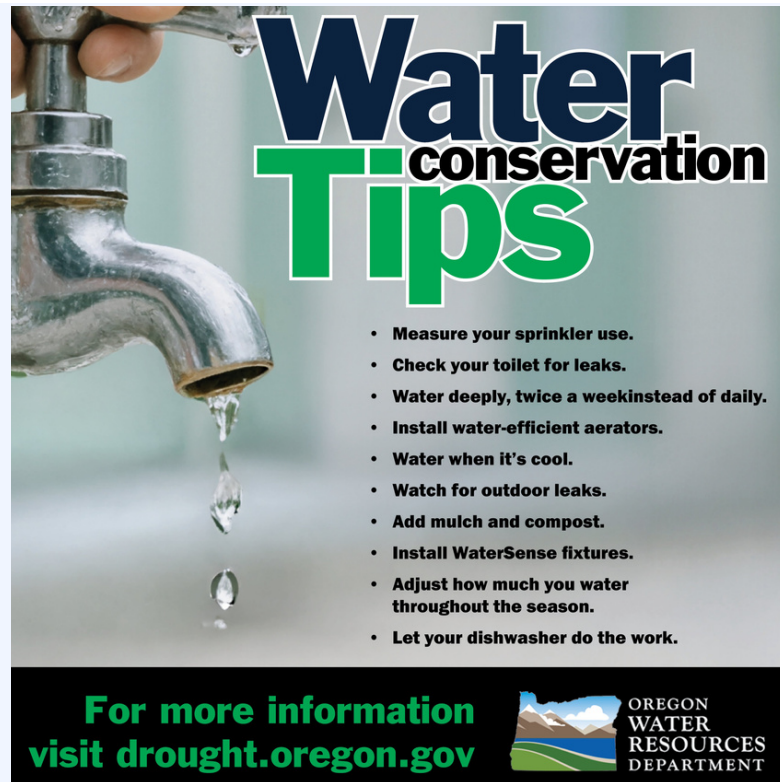

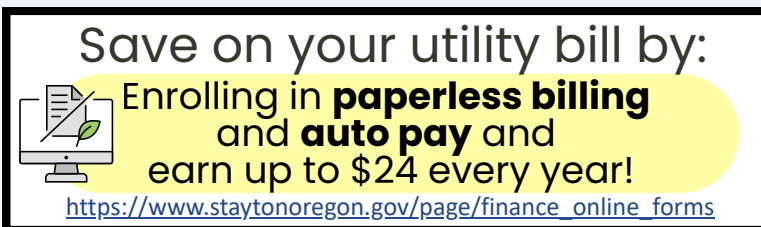


Water conservation Tips

Full Circle Farming: Woolly Fun Fibers on August 4 at 11 a.m.

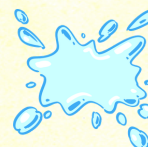
Avoid baa-d days by getting woolly into the world of sheep and fiber arts.
