Jeanette Philips on behalf of Ron Durham, Peach Ave. Resident, spoke about the dust in the air from traffic on the gravel road (Peach Ave.), safety for his family, driver's speed. Mayor Quigley read letters submitted by: Sara Keudell regarding the proximity of a marijuana shop to family friendly downtown businesses and keeping the town family friendly. Terri Vandercoevering stating that she and her family stay away from downtown due to the odor coming from the marijuana shop. Sue Coffin comparing the hours of operation for local pharmacies and potential safety concerns if the hours are extended. Jill Johnson regarding lawlessness as a result of drug use. Adam Culbertson, Owner of Homegrown Remedies, clarified for the record that he does not have an opinion on the ruling and that it was not his business that requested the amendment. Questions from the Council Council recalled the initial extension request, stating the request was to extend the operating hours to 8 p.m. Council guestioned if there are increased crime trends due to sales in the evening. 	The projects, combined, will provide a year-round draw both inside and outside of the community. The Riverfront Park South portion of the project will improve the existing parking area by re-grading and paving the lot, installing fencing to limit overnight parking/access, removing vegetation including trees to allow better visual access to the river, provide picnic tables, signage and access to the river for fishing, wading and other recreational activities. This will provide visual and physical access to the North Santiam River that does not currently easily exist. It will also provide a better secondary access into Riverfront Park and the existing trail system. Overtime, we envision picnic structures and other amenities for families that want to come to visit Stayton or those that wish to stay in Stayton.  Motion passes 3:1 (Giglio).
