Staff will collect their contact information and provide them with information on how to access the meeting to provide comments.
- <u>Written Comment</u>: Written comment submitted to <u>citygovernment@staytonoregon.gov</u> at least three hours prior to the meeting start time will be provided to the public body in advance of the meeting and added to the City Council's webpage where agenda packets are posted.

SUBJECT:	Appointment of Council Liaisons

Resolution No. 1027 adopted the most current Council rules and indicates the Mayor shall appoint one or more Council members to serve as a Council Liaison in one of 5 categories:

- 1. Education, Social Services, Governmental Agencies;
- 2. Economic Development and Housing;
- 3. Public Safety and Environmental;
- 4. Community Relations and Outreach;
- 5. Transportation and Infrastructure (or Public Utilities).

After discussion, the Mayor and Council determined it would be appropriate to add specific Council liaisons to certain boards and commissions to ensure two-way communication between boards and commissions in Stayton. While we've had Councilors appointed to boards and commissions, as well as external organizations, there are now new Councilors, and it is necessary to discuss and appoint who will be serving in the capacity in this upcoming year. The following is a list of the prior appointments:

- Planning Commission (Meets last Mondy) Steve Sims
- Parks and Recreation Board (Meets 1st Tuesday) Ben McDonald
- Library Board (Meets 3rd Wednesday) Jordan Ohrt
- Sewer Committee (per Stayton-Sublimity Sewer agreement/meetings vary) Brian Quigley
- Public Arts Commission (newly active Meets the 3rd Thursday) David Patty
- School Board (meets 3rd Thursday) David Patty
- Chamber Board (uncertain of meeting dates) David Giglio
- Santiam Hospital Board (uncertain of meeting dates) Brian Quigley
- Revitalize Downtown Stayton (Meets 2nd Wednesday) Jordan Ohrt

As a reminder, the purpose and expectations of the Council liaison is to:

- 1. Have a specific Council member who is the contact if there are questions or need of Council information by the Board or Commission;
- 2. To attend meetings as able and applicable in order to convey to the Council what is happening at the board and commission meetings; and
- 3. To convey to the board and commissions updates from Council on discussion and activity that might be pertinent to the Board and Commission.

This is a discussion only. A resolution formalizing the appointments will be prepared for the next meeting.
