


# **All Ages**

# **Celebrate Family History Month**

Did you know October is Family History Month? Interested in researching your own family history, but not sure where to start? Accessible from all Library computers, Ancestry Library is an indispensable resource for genealogists and historians. Sources include: censuses, vital records, immigration records, family histories, military records, court and legal documents, directories, photos and maps. You can find a video tutorial through the CCRLS catalog under Resource Guides, use the Learning Center at Ancestry Library, or get help from Library staff.


