Director's Report

- a. Library Services update
 - We've started a community drive to support Santiam Hospital & Clinics' Santiam Service Integration by collecting non-perishable food items throughout the month of November. The Library will also donate perishable food items to the Stayton Community Food Bank through the Collect the Stubs program. For every 25 library check-out receipt stubs collected, library staff will donate one perishable food item to support the community.
 - Our Sippin' into a Social Hour program is tomorrow and will center around fondue and food trays. We had 18 people attend our first one in October, and it was exciting to see the conversations and connections being built.
 - Twenty-three people joined us for an After-Hours showing of the movie Wicked: Part One. We were able to show it in the center of the Library with popcorn and a themed drink.

SUBJECT: November Library report

In November, the Library ran a community food drive and created a "Collect the Stubs" campaign to support Santiam Hospital & Clinics' Santiam Service Integration by collecting non-perishable food items throughout the month. The Library also donated perishable food items to the Stayton Community Food Bank through the Collect the Stubs program. For every 25 library check-out receipt stubs collected, library staff donated one perishable food item to support the community. Over 340 pounds of food for the Stayton Food Bank and Santiam Hospital. In addition, more than 1,000 stubs were collected, leading Library staff to donate 40 additional food items. Thank you to everyone who participated and helped support our local families!

Janna and Jennifer opened our Wreath Lab, and 216 people of all ages created their own wreaths. We want to thank Hiatt Christmas Trees for donating the greens! Thirty-eight people joined us for our Sippin' into a Social Hour, a program we've designed to offer people opportunities to explore and connect through new experiences and conversations at the Library. Children of all ages unleashed their inner builders with our LEGOs at our STEAM Lab for an hour after school every afternoon for a week. We held an After Hours @ the Library showing of Wicked: Part One and celebrated cats of all shapes and sizes with feline-focused crafts at a drop-in Make & Take Day.

Evie represented Stayton at the Polk, Marion, and Yamhill (PYM) Circulation meeting, and Jennifer and Janna provided activities at Literacy Night for Regis St. Mary and also at Head Start's parent event.
